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A 4th grade teacher's lesson plan uses the Hobbit and Auden to expose kids to the absurdity of war. High school teacher Franklin Balske is working with students at Lewis And Clark High School in Bend, Oregon. His class is studying literature through the lens of conflict and the use of non-fiction writing. As part of their reading, students are reading Shakespeare's Coriolanus, a text that is full of violence. Balske, who teaches 4th grade art/social studies, has his class read Auden's "September 1, 1939" to get kids thinking about the circumstances surrounding World War II. The poem is often quoted, and a quick Google search will bring you to the work of countless famous folks. Auden himself told an interviewer that "September 1, 1939" "is my best poem.
